Priority Area:	Primary Care Engagement and Leadership
Deliverables	In alignment with the Ministry's Primary Care Network (PCN) guidance, advance a primary care structure that organizes and engages interprofessional primary care providers (family physicians, NPs and other primary care clinicians) in ÉSOCDOHT planning, decision-making, and implementation of clinical priorities. Develop, implement, and/or report on progress of plans to connect additional interprofessional primary care providers to the ÉSOCDOHT's PCN or other similar structure.
Broad Objectives	Engage primary care providers across the district (Physicians, NPs, allied health in primary care) in the OHT and development of a PCN for the ÉSOCDOHT. Leverage the PCN readiness assessment that was completed in early 2024 and continue establishing key priorities and update the readiness assessment as appropriate. Completion of the PCN readiness assessment will be conducted annually in collaboration with all primary care partners.
